The teachers danced and sang popular carols to wish their students. The significance of the festival was explained to the students through the Christmas story.
































cience Day was celebrated by the Pre Primary on 27-02-2021.

The children participated and enjoyed doing the experiments monitored by their parents.


























It was an hands-on session to teach students the art and science of composting

Keeping the doors of learning open

Activity Based Learning sessions for Sindhians studying in classes 1 and 2 were conducted on Saturdays. Though teaching was done virtually, students demonstrated that they "know and are able to do" whatever was taught. The curious learners engaged playing with objects and responded well to music, rhythm and colours. They learned mathematical concepts by forming shapes such as squares, lines and circles with sticks or pebbles. Love for Math was further reinforced through Math 'O' Art and Cup O Mania activities. They loved the interplay of light, sound, movement, shape, shadow, and colour in the Air, Magic and Space, Water Rainbow and the Biscuit activities. The language lessons were reinvented through activities such as Low cost... no cost, Riddle Mee Ree, Swaron Ka Khel, Kannada Activity--Fun with Mask. Visual and hands on experiences such as exploring cereals or pulses in the kitchen, Chef of the day - cooking without fire, Best out of waste, Sculpting in sand, Painting with fingers, Scribbling with crayons, paints and charcoals, Playing with props like stones and salt helped ignite their minds.




















NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY

On the third Saturday of February 2021, an online orientation, briefing the National Education Policy was presented to all the parents by the Principal of our school. NEP is a diverse policy that aims to meet the future learning needs which will engrain practical skill-based learning to shape the learners. Many unskilled professions will be taken over by Machines. But the need for the skilled work force particularly in the fields like Mathematics, Computer Science in conjunction with multidisciplinary abilities across the Sciences and humanities will be on the rise and in greater demand.

Students will now have greater flexibility in choosing their subjects as rigid demarcation between Arts and Sciences, curricular and extracurricular subjects, or vocational and academic streams will cease to exist.

Education thus must move towards less content driven and more towards critical thinking based approach and how to be creative, multi-disciplinary, innovative, adapt and observe new materials in novel and changing fields

The NEP 2020 will now replace the 10+2 system by a 5+3+3+4 curricular structure, which includes three years of pre-schooling in Anganwadi centres for children between three to eight years of age, followed by another 12 years of formal schooling. This is the first time that an NEP has extended government outreach to pre-schooling, which will include nursery education and kindergarten levels.

In all stages, Experimental learning will be adopted including hands on learning, arts integrated, sports integrated education and story telling based pedagogy among others as standard pedagogy within each subjects, and with explorations of relations, among different subjects.


To close the gap in achievement of learning outcomes, classroom transactions will shift towards competency based learning and education.

In a nutshell, NEP aims at building a global best education system rooted in Indian ethos, thereby transforming India into a global knowledge superpower.





We ended the program with a relaxing round of meditation where we could connect to our inner self and be more aware of our surroundings.
















Reading Week




















"One has the responsibility to keep our homes, surroundings and city clean"
