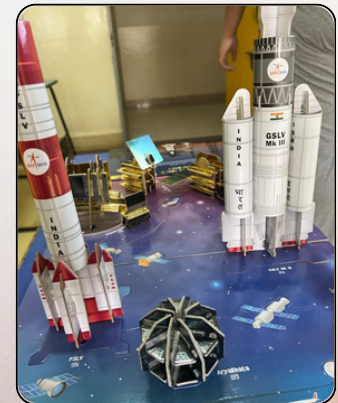
National Space Day

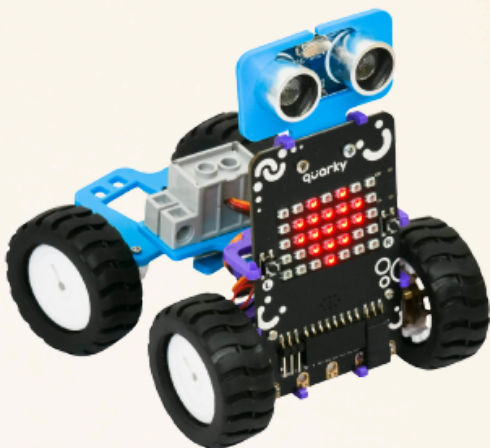
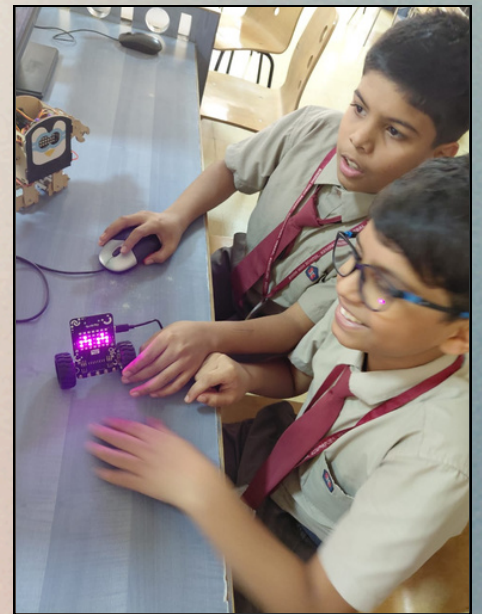
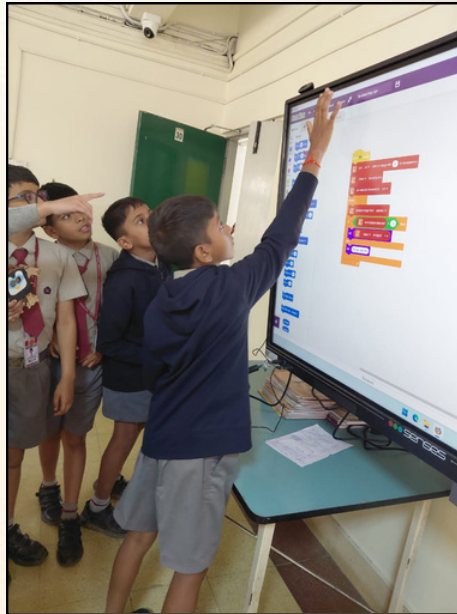

It was almost ten years ago, sometime in 2016, on the eve of Ramzan. Around 4:30 in the evening, I was riding back home on my two-wheeler when, without warning, my bike came to a complete halt. The stretch of road was unsettling—vehicles sped past relentlessly, bordered only by the long, silent compound wall of a government office. There was nothing and no one around.

I somehow managed to drag the bike to the side and tried everything I could—starting it, kicking it, hoping for a miracle. Nothing worked. A few auto drivers passing by stopped briefly and tried to help, but their efforts were in vain. Time moved slowly. By 5:30, exhaustion and helplessness had set in. There were no mechanic shops open, no services available, and no one at home to reach out to. Leaving the bike behind was not an option—it was an isolated road, and fear crept in quietly.

Just when despair was beginning to overpower hope, around 5:45, a young man in his mid-twenties approached me. With a gentle voice and genuine concern, he asked if he could help. I had no choice—but more than that, I felt a wave of relief. Someone cared. He tied my scooter to his bike and towed it with great effort. We went from one mechanic shop to another—six in all—but every shutter was closed. He made calls to his friends, but none could come; it was the time for evening namaz, especially significant on the eve of Ramzan. Yet, he did not give up.

His home was nearby. "You can wait here, ma'am," he said reassuringly. His sister welcomed me in and offered coffee, even as the household was busy preparing for the sacred festival the next day. I waited there until my father arrived, and eventually, a mechanic was arranged and my bike was repaired.

Later, I learned something that stayed with me forever—he had missed his evening prayer, just to help a stranger like me. That act of selflessness left an indelible mark on my heart. Every Ramzan, this memory returns—not just as an incident, but as a reminder. A reminder that humanity rises above rituals, that kindness needs no introduction, and that helping a stranger can become someone else's lifelong gratitude.

We may not know everyone we help, but the support we give can become someone's strength.
