Makar Sankranti is celebrated with different names and customs in different parts of India. The festival is known as Lohri in North India, Makara Sankranti in Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh, Magh Bihu in Assam, and Pongal in Tamil Nadu. The day marks the winter solstice. Students of classes 5-12 celebrated on the school ground. A colorful stage was recreated to celebrate the festival and to enable the children to understand the importance of how and why the festival is celebrated. This helped them appreciate the traditions associated with it. The harvest festival was introduced to children through a story which highlighted the significance of the festival. Be it the reason behind using jaggery in the sweets or the importance of flying kites, when the children realise the significance, they enjoy the festival and its traditions. With the help of a colourful backdrop, picture cards and real materials like mango leaves toran, yellu bella (sesame and jaggery), sakkarae acchu (sugar dolls), kabbu (sugar cane) and clay pots the festival came to life! It helped the children understand the importance of the harvest festival and helped to inculcate moral values like politeness, sharing, respect towards elders, and respect for nature. Music, speeches, songs, dances, skits and, kite flying also reinforced the concept of Sankranti where people worship the Sun God.




18TH PRIMARY ANNUAL DAY - UDAAN










18TH JUNIOR ANNUAL DAY-VISMAYA


18TH ANNUAL DAY - DHWANI

This day is special in the sense that it marks the birthday of **Sadhu T.L. Vaswani**, who was a great Indian educationist and began the Mira movement for the upliftment of Indian education system. Sindhians celebrated this day enthusiastically, by taking pledge, conducting special assemblies and spreading the message to adopt the vegetarian way of living.





Sadhu Vaswani – Leading by Example

"No nation is truly free until the animal, man's younger brother is free and happy." - Sadhu Vaswani

I, H.R. Achala of class 11 studying in Sindhi High School, Hebbal would like to take this opportunity to share my views about Sadhu Vaswani who was an educationist and above all a great human being who believed in spreading love among all living beings.

Sadhu Vaswani was born Thanwardas Lilaram Vaswani on 25 November, 1879 in Hyderabad Sindh to Lilaram and Varandevi. As a young boy, he attended the academy there. He completed his B.A., M.A. and later became a professor at Union Academy.

Sadhu Vaswani was an active member in India's freedom struggle. He influenced the Sindh branch of the Indian National Congress to pass a resolution supporting the Non-Cooperation movement. He was a strong proponent of women empowerment and believed in providing equal educational opportunities to women to ensure that they would not be just confined to their homes. One of his significant initiatives was to start a school for girls, popularly known as the Mira Movement in Education.

Sadhu Vaswani was deeply inclined towards spirituality. He believed in the oneness of mankind. His love was all encompassing without boundaries including animals, birds and human beings and even the inanimate. He lived his words and promoted vegetarianism. In his honour, the International Meatless day is celebrated on 25-November every year. It was his philosophy that forgiveness has the power to bring calm and peacefulness in our lives. A moment of calm can do wonders to our lives and when done collectively as a society, it is a positive step towards love and peace. That is the essence behind observing Moment of Calm on o2-Aug each year.

Sadhu was a born orator with the words coming straight from his heart and mesmerizing the listeners. He was also a prolific writer who authored books including those on Hinduism, universality of religions, humanity and India's freedom movement.

Sadhu Vaswani was a pioneer of his times promoting causes unheard of at that time that is, the upliftment of women. His passion towards education is evident even now by the sheer number of educational institutions that are functioning under the aegis of the Sadhu Vaswani Mission.

It would be appropriate to quote Sadhu Vaswani "Education should be related to life and not be an academic study" Do as much good as you can, to as many as you can, on as many occasions as you can and as long as you can. Thank you all for giving me this opportunity to speak about one of the greatest saints of the twentieth century.














SCHOOL SHAPES THE WORLD OF TOMORROW

Pure mathematics is the world's best game...

22nd December, is a very special one. The shortest day, the day of winter solstice and one more important event took place more than a hundred years ago. The birth of a genius mathematician, in India, in the blessed city of Erode, Srinivas Ramanujan was born. As you read, you will know why Ramanujan was such an incredible person who made an indelible impact during his short life...

In 1900, just a 13yr old boy, and he mastered S.L.Loney's Advanced Trignometry. He was so brilliant, that at this tender age itself he was able to solve sophisticated theorems with no teacher's help. At 16, in one year, he mastered G.S Carr's book with 5000 theorems. The very next year, he studied probability, statistics, number theory and data analysis and found out the value of the Euler-Mascheroni constant correct upto 15 decimal places. He is also defined that 0 divided by 0 is infinity. With these achievements, Ramanujan had baffled even, V.Ramswamy Aiyer, the founder of the Indian Mathematical society. Undoubtedly he was a gifted child, but he also drifted wild.

Haven't you wondered why we haven't heard much about about him other than mathematics, despite his innumerable contributions? Such a great mathematician, had his own defects. Ramanujan was obsessed with mathematics. It wasn't just mere love for mathematics that drove him, but obsession. And anything in larger quantities is not good, his obsession was not good. His love for maths was justified, but because of his obsession he lost on his chance to get a degree, failed in other subjects in college. He used to spend his day and night solving Mathematics, and neither ate well, nor concentrated a bit on other subjects, hence he could not make any mark on anything else. He had lived a life in poverty, because, no degree, meant no job, no job meant no money, no money meant no food.

Despite these shortcomings, he put up utmost resilience in life. He has escaped the mouth of death many times in life, smallpox, gastric ulcer, tuberculosis, all these diseases confronted him. Yet, he remained focused regarding his goal in life. All of us must adopt this vital value, to never give up, and face all circumstances in life courageously.

Recognizing his potential, G.H. Hardy desperately wanted to bring Ramanujan to England. And for sure, all of us, or the ones who remember the cube and cube roots chapter, have read of the Hardy-Ramanujan number. 1729, what a dull number for G.H. Hardy, but Ramanujan found beauty in even in such an odd number.

Unfortunately, when Ramanujan reached England, in 1914, guess what. It was the World War 1 going on. A very unfortunate time because of which the mathematicians in England couldn't find much time to decode the complex theorems which he had written without steps. So, those went unrecognized. This tells us the importance of writing steps, and that's something Ramanujan didn't do.

There are innumerable contributions of his in the field of science and mathematics. Seldom do people look at these to understand the values conveyed. And that's of utmost importance. So, this mathematics day, lets pledge to learn from his life, positively, in addition to respecting and honouring him. After all, Life is like a math equation, in order to gain the most, you need to convert the negatives to positives.






The sin that engulfs our world


Enriching Life

A Case Study Why is India's Himalayan town sinking?







Joshimath, is a city in Chamoli District in the Indian state of Uttarakhand. Located at a height of 6150 feet (1875 m), it is a gateway to several Himalayan mountain climbing expeditions, trekking trails and pilgrim centres like Badrinath. Recently in the year 2021 a horrifying incident took place in Uttarakhand. Since 7 February 2021, the area was severely affected by the immense number of floods that year and its aftermath. A few days ago, a notification popped across all our phones stating the sinking of the holy town of Joshimath has plunged into a full-blown crisis after houses and roads developed cracks due to land subsidence. So far numerous houses have developed cracks and many families have been temporarily moved to safer locations. The town has been declared a landslide and subsidence-hit zone. The Centre has stressed on the safety of the people and has asked experts to prepare short- and long-term plans for conservation and rehabilitation. The whole country was in a blue by the news this because it is from here one has to traverse to the famous trekking destination in Uttarakhand, Valley of Flowers.

So exactly why did this happen let's get a detailed review on this?

The Uttarakhand State Disaster Management Authority (USDMA) published a report in September 2022 that mainly blamed the ill-planned construction in the town as an important reason behind land sinking. The report also pointed out that the inadequate drainage and wastewater disposal systems had exacerbated the problem. Geologist said that since there is no wastewater management, most houses have soak pits that have pushed down loose material into the ground, resulting in land sinking. Joshimath is built on a slope with deposits from an old landslide. The deposits might have stabilised over time but rampant construction and projects like roads and dams that use explosives, drilling and extensive digging have weakened the slopes. The land subsidence problem occurred decades ago too.

Road for revival

Experts are of the opinion that the population must be sent to a safer ground first. Later, all construction activities and hydroelectric projects must be ended immediately. "Many houses in the town are unlikely to survive and people living in them must be shifted to safe locations as life is precious," he said. After the evacuation of people in affected areas to safety, microzonation of the town, re-planning of its drainage system and rainwater outlets besides assessment of rock strength among others should be taken. The other recommendations included developing a pucca drainage system in the town to stop seepage of rainwater, avoiding digging at slopes and collecting construction material in the five-kilometre vicinity, and a ban on chopping trees to prevent landslides. However, despite these recommendations, the construction of roads, dams, tunnels, and multi-storey buildings continued unabated. The situation is so bad now that the very existence of Joshimath is danger. At the present we must ensure that the residences don't panic and stay calm to sum up I would like to say "We cannot stop natural disasters but we can arm ourselves with knowledge"





FIRST INDIAN GALLANTRY AWARD WINNER MAJOR SOMNATH SHARMA

Param Vir Chakra

In Himachal Pradesh's Dadh district of Kangra, Major Somnath Sharma was born on Januray 31st, 1923. His father, brother, sisters all worked for the Army, therefore he came from a real military family. Under Colonel K.S. Thimmayya, afterwards the army leader, Major Sharma served in the British Army during World War II in Burma. He was sent to Arakan for his first posting, where he distinguished himself. When one of the soldiers was hurt during battling the Japanese in Arakan, he carried the wounded man, Bahadur on his shoulders to a safe place. As a result for his bravery, he received a "Mention in Dispatch".
